COMMISSION MEETING  
NOVEMBER 10, 2025**

Commissioner Grebloski called the November 10, 2025 Commission Meeting to order at 6:07PM, followed by the pledge of allegiance and a moment of silence.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA:** Commissioner Meck made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Strause to approve the agenda. All commissioners voted, "Aye". Motion carried.

**FOR THE RECORD:** There was an executive session held after the commission meeting on 10/13/25 to discuss personnel and pending litigation. There were budget workshops held on 10/20/25 and 10/27/25.

**APPROVE MINUTES:** Commissioner Strause made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Meck to approve the October 13, 2025 Commission Meeting minutes. All commissioners voted, "Aye". Motion carried.

Chief Keiser then went over some things of note for the month of October. He said that the department had less calls and did not have the number of violent crimes that it had in September. He stated that the License Plate Readers (LPR's) have been installed in all but 1 intersection and will be up and running soon. The intersection at 73 and Ontelaunee is not installed, yet. In personnel news, Officer Curilla is off of FTO. Detective Sgt. Wood's detective vehicle is back from the upfitter. We held a safe trick or treat event on October 30<sup>th</sup> and it was a great success. We have placed ads for both patrol officers and chief of police. The department teamed up with Fleetwood PD to complete defensive tactics training.

**BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR:** Guy Mohr, of 12 Calais Drive, stated that more trucks are cutting through again. There is a Ryder truck that comes through every morning around 8:10AM. There are also various trash trucks going through. He has already called a couple of the companies to report these trucks, but nothing has been done. Commissioner Grebloski asked Guy Mohr if he would be willing to testify if citations were issued and he said he would. He said he can start taking pictures of the trucks and will also call it into the dispatch so that there is a record of his complaint.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Alysia Fredericks reported that we are still planning on moving forward with the impound lot project. She will be asking for fence proposals and we hope to complete this in 2026.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**2026 Draft Budget** – Commissioner Grebloski made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Strause to table the motion to approve the 2026 Budget until the next commission meeting and to also authorize Alysia Fredericks to contact the Leesport Borough secretary to discuss the budget. All commissioners voted, "Aye". Motion carried.

**Consider quote from Motorola Solutions for the 3 year Vaas (Video as a service) extension at a cost of \$14,868.00/year (\$44,604/00 total)** – Chief Keiser explained that this 3 year extension will be a substantial savings to stay with Motorola rather than switching to another manufacturer, such as Axon. We would also receive upgraded cameras. If we add another vehicle to the fleet, they will also waive the cost to add the equipment to the vehicle. When we first went with this service, it was called Watchguard and they were one of the only companies to have both body worn cameras and in car cameras. Now, Axon has both of these services, so there is more competition in the market. Commissioner Meck made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Strause to approve the 3 year extension with Motorola Solutions. All commissioners voted, "Aye". Motion carried.

**Consider a motion to hold a department/commission holiday dinner** – In 2024, the holiday dinner was held in the township building. The commission spoke and decided to look for a different venue. Commissioner Strause made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Meck to hold a holiday party with expenses not to exceed \$2,500. All commissioners voted, "Aye". Motion carried.

**ADJOURN:** Commissioner Meck made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Strause to adjourn the meeting. All commissioners voted, "Aye". Motion carried and meeting was adjourned at 6:29 PM.
